TRANSPORTATION

BY CAR UMMA has very limited street parking on State Street. The closest structures are the W13 Parking Lot (Thompson Street) and Republic Parking (South Forest Avenue).

BY BUS UMMA is accessible by the AATA buses (routes 6 and 62) and the U-M Blue Buses (Commuter North and Commuter South).

UMMA's collections are among the oldest in the nation in university hands and include more than 21,000 objects from Western, Asian, and African traditions as well as Modern & Contemporary art. With the award-winning Maxine and Stuart Frankel and the Frankel Family Wing's addition in 2009, the Museum has doubled in size and features open-storage galleries and study rooms, state-of-the-art conservation and art storage facilities, a curatorial research center, and a 225-seat auditorium for performing arts programming.

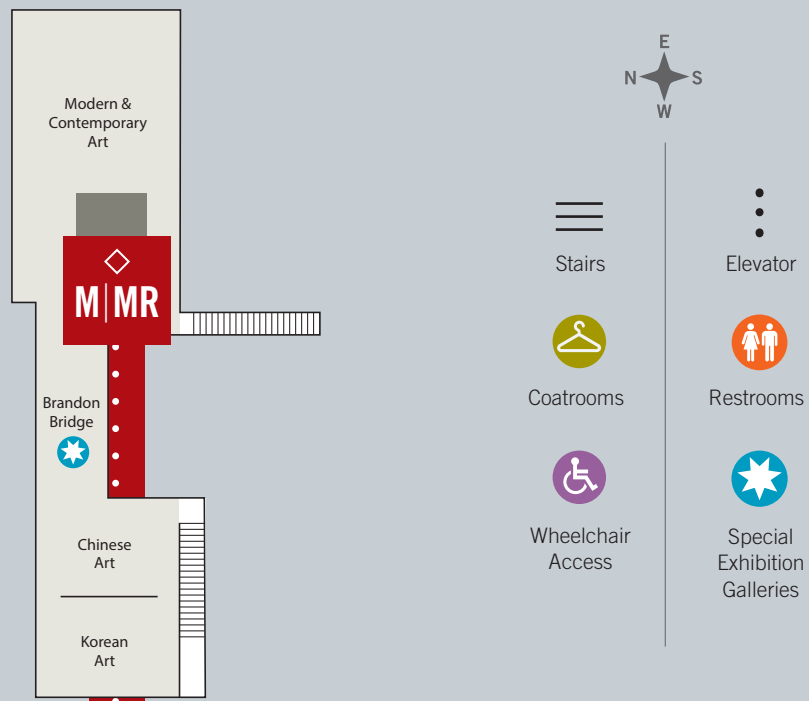

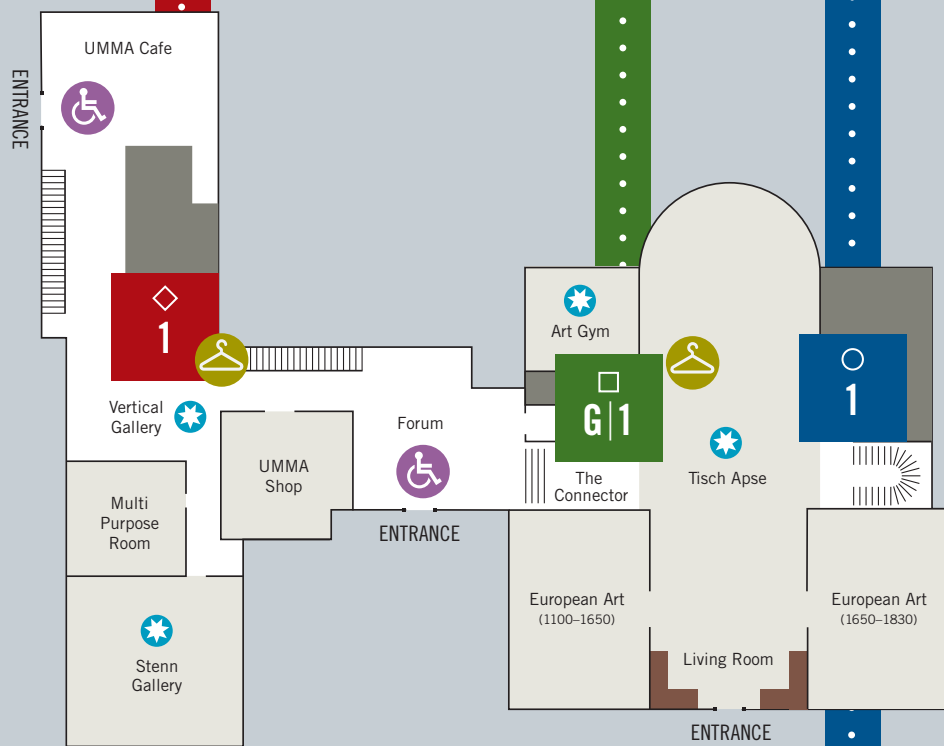

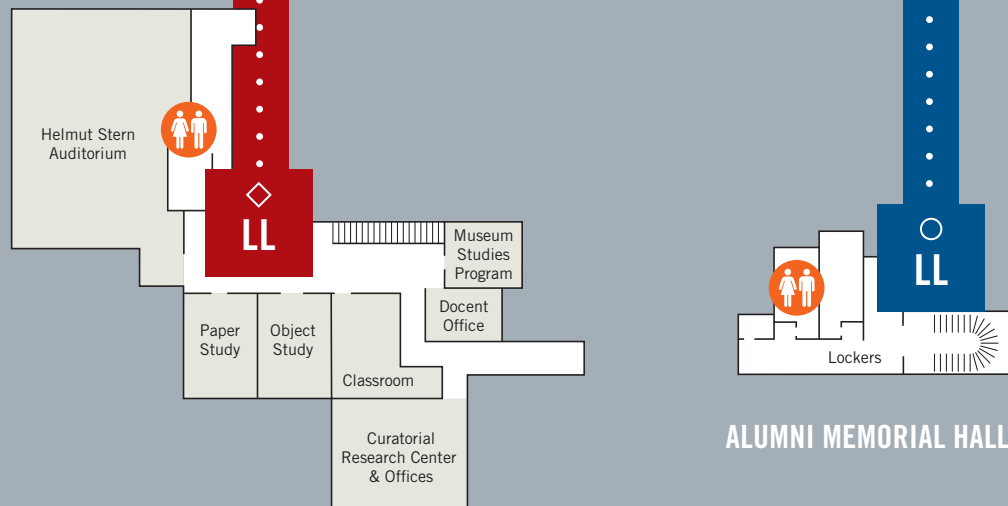
